3 (a) The objects to be pursued by the company on its incorporation are:

I. Higher Education :

a. To promote, administer, advertise, either on its own or through fully equipped schools, play schools, colleges, educational institutes, universities including deemed or autonomous universities and to promote and disseminate knowledge, create awareness and provide a common forum of interaction amongst academicians, professionals establish effective co-ordination, to organise training courses and special programs to impart training & education in all the disciplines.

b. To guide, provide or arrange free education/scholarships to meritorious and underprivileged children and to promote and help for eradication of illiteracy in the society.

c. Provide vocational / educational guidance and counselling and/or establishing, supporting, conducting, vocational guidance bureau either virtual or real.

d. To promote work for education and development of IT, Women Entrepreneurship, Skill Training, Industrial Development & Education Training, Entrepreneur

Development Program and MSME trainings, Hand Made Paper Bags Training, Industrial Motivation Campaign, Solar Power Plant Training and other related trainings.

e. To promote and run in any part of India, Study centre, oral coaching classes, community centres, virtual training programs where in professional, technical, vocational or higher education is to be imparted in every field of science, commerce, arts, computers, self-defence training and martial art or any other type of education be imparted by conducting regular, part time classes and to promote teacher welfare activities.

f. To promote, administer, advertise and conduct welfare programs for Teachers by way of providing facilities and other technical and vocational trainings, which help them to improve their knowledge and skills.

g. Advancement and promotion of education, learning and skill development amongst individuals and businesses, to be the provision of information, advice, coordination and guidance, including the guidance for career choices to the people of all age groups.

II. Healthcare Support:

a. To promote primary health care to slum dwellers, if and when required, and to make it accessible to all by providing the same at their doorsteps with particular attention to the child health care, adolescent girls, women and to create health awareness among the underprivileged children, girls and women.

b. To provide, guide, educate and to create health awareness program and to make, develop, build, promote Health Care Centre for the underprivileged public.

c. To arrange and provide

such medical aid and such other necessary for living to the needy persons who are otherwise incapable or handicapped or mentally or physically retarded.

d. e. To implement a strategy for eradicating malnutrition and achieving optimum nutrition for all by stressing on the need for breast feeding, adopting play way methods of teaching and raising them with love and care for the overall development of their brains. This combination of nature and nurture establishes the foundation of a child's future.

f. To work in rural, tribal and slum areas and provide services to pre-school children in an integrated manner so as to ensure proper growth and development in them.

g. To work towards empowerment of women and their families through various means.

h. To reduce dowry harassment, child marriage, female genital mutilation, infanticide, gender bias and eliminate human trafficking.

H. Free access to basic amenities like food and medical care

I. Free care support to individual by assessing the needs performed by doctors and experts taking into account the types of medical services, care services and assistance the senior requires using SMART (specific, measurable, attainable/achievable, relevant and time bound) method.

a. To alienate by way of sale, lease, mortgage, hypothecation, pledge, exchange, hiring out, gift or otherwise with or without security, the properties of the company or any portion thereof including the marking or giving subscription(s), contribution(s) or there wise to charitable institution(s), educational, benevolent, social welfare or other institutional bodies, person(s) as from time to time may deem necessary.

b. To use all income from the property movable or immovable or from the works of the company as such whomsoever derived for the objects of the company, that no portion thereof be distributed among its members or staff by way of profits or any other form, except remuneration for services rendered to the company.

c. To take guarantee from any public charitable institutions, trusts, societies and other such organizations as the Board of Directors may deem it in the interest of the company for furtherance of the objects of the Company and

the doing of all such other lawful things as considered necessary for the furtherance of the above objects:

Provided that the company shall not support with its funds, or endeavor to impose on, or procure to be observed by its members or others, any regulation or restriction which, as an object of the company, would make it a trade union.

4 *The objects of the company extend to the

whole of India.

5 (i) The profits, if any, or other income and property of the company, when-so-ever derived, shall be applied, solely for the promotion of its objects as set forth in this memorandum.

(ii) No portion of the profits, other income or property aforesaid shall be paid or transferred, directly or indirectly, by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit, to persons who, at any time are, or have been, members of the company or to any one or more of them or to any persons claiming through any one or more of them.

(iii) No remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth shall be given by the company to any of its members, whether officers or members of the company or not, except payment of out-of-pocket expenses, reasonable and proper interest on money lent, or reasonable and proper rent on premises let to the company.

(iv) Nothing in this clause shall prevent the payment by the company in good faith of prudent remuneration to any of its officers or servants (not being members) or to any other person (not being member), in return for any services actually rendered to the company.

(v) Nothing in these clauses (iii) and (iv) shall prevent the payment by the company in good faith of prudence remuneration to any of its members in return for any services (not being services of a kind which are required to be rendered by a member), actually rendered to the company

6 No alteration shall be made to this memorandum of association or to the articles of association of the company which are for the time being in force, unless the alteration has been previously submitted to and approved by the Registrar.

7 The liability of the members is limited.
